Poetic License

Haiku is a form of traditional Japanese poetry that consists of three unrhyming lines of five, seven, and five syllables. The short poems are often void of any figurative language, instead imparting feeling and thoughtfulness with plain concrete language and imagery. Try your hand at penning one of these poems on April 17, International Haiku Day. Haiku began in 13th-century Japan, not as their own poems, but as *hokku*, which are the opening lines of *renga*, expansive oral poems spoken by multiple poets. It wasn't until the 16th century that hokku became a form all its own, and not until 100 years later the poet Matsuo Basho elevated it as an art form. It was Masaoka Shiki, poet of the late 19th century, who first called the poems *haiku*. Perhaps the most famous haiku was written by Basho:

old pond
frog leaps in
water's sound
